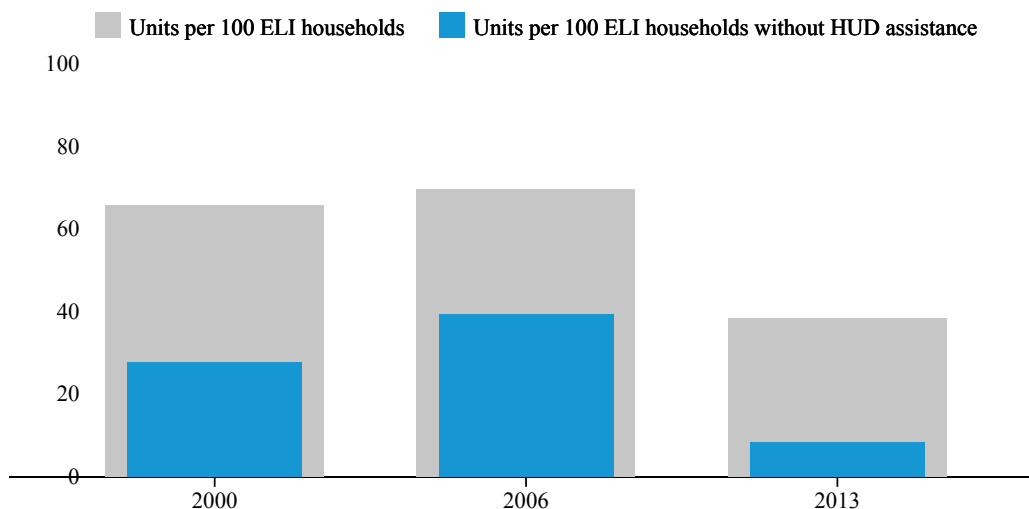




## MAPPING AMERICA'S RENTAL HOUSING CRISIS

### Charles County, MD



The following data examine extremely low-income renter households (ELI households) and the number of adequate, affordable, and available rental units (units).

\* Extremely low-income households earn no more than 30 percent of the area median income. In this county, the income cutoff for a household of four was \$24,200 in 2000, \$28,350 in 2007, and \$32,200 in 2013.
